No one can predict the distant future accurately, but experts can give us a good idea of what changes will take place in the next twenty or thirty years' time. They tell us how our towns and cities will change. For example, there will be more tall buildings and fewer individual houses. There will be solar panels on all buildings to produce electricity. We also have a good idea of what transport will be like. It's likely that there will be fewer cars, especially in cities, because of pollution and the cost of fuel. Trains will become the main form of transport. They will be faster and more comfortable and reliable than they are today. Fewer people will travel by plane as the cost of fuel goes up, but by the end of the century new forms of cheap, clean fuel will make inter-continental flights common again.

Experts don't agree about how education might change. Some say that in the future, classes will be smaller. Others say that classes will be bigger, with two teachers in the same class – an interesting idea because the teachers can teach together and learn from each other, and students will learn more from two teachers. Some experts say that students will have more homework; others say they will have less! But most agree that schools in the future will be much bigger and there won't be as many as there are today. Some classes won't have teachers at all because teaching will happen online. All students will have their own tablets. School timetables will be different and students won't study at the same time. Some students will come to school earlier in the morning and leave at lunchtime while other students will have classes in the afternoon. Another prediction is that there won't be any school libraries in the future because all books will be online.

There is one thing that few experts tell us about – how discipline and punishments will change! What will happen to naughty students? Will all students behave well in the future? No, bad behaviour at school is one thing that I think will stay the same!
