The Great Barrier Reef

The Great Barrier Reef is located off the coast of Australia. It is one of seven natural wonders of the world. And it's no wonder! Because of its beauty above and below the water, the Great Barrier Reef is one of the most visited tourist spots in the world. There are over 800 tour companies taking about 1.6 million visitors to see the reef each year!

The Great Barrier Reef is the largest reef in the world. It is larger than the Great Wall of China and can be seen from space. It is over 3,000 kilometers long, and its widest part is 65 kilometers wide. There are many archipelagos in the reef with over 900 islands in this part of the Pacific Ocean, which is called the Coral Sea.

The Great Barrier Reef is home to more animals than people, including sea turtles, dolphins, and giant clams.

The reef is about 500,000 years old, but it has changed over time. The current formation of the reef is about 6,000 to 8,000 years old.

People living on the coast of Australia have known about the reef for thousands of years. In 1770, James Cook sailed the length of the reef. His boat was damaged by the reef, and he was forced to spend six weeks repairing it. During this time, he and his team studied the reef.

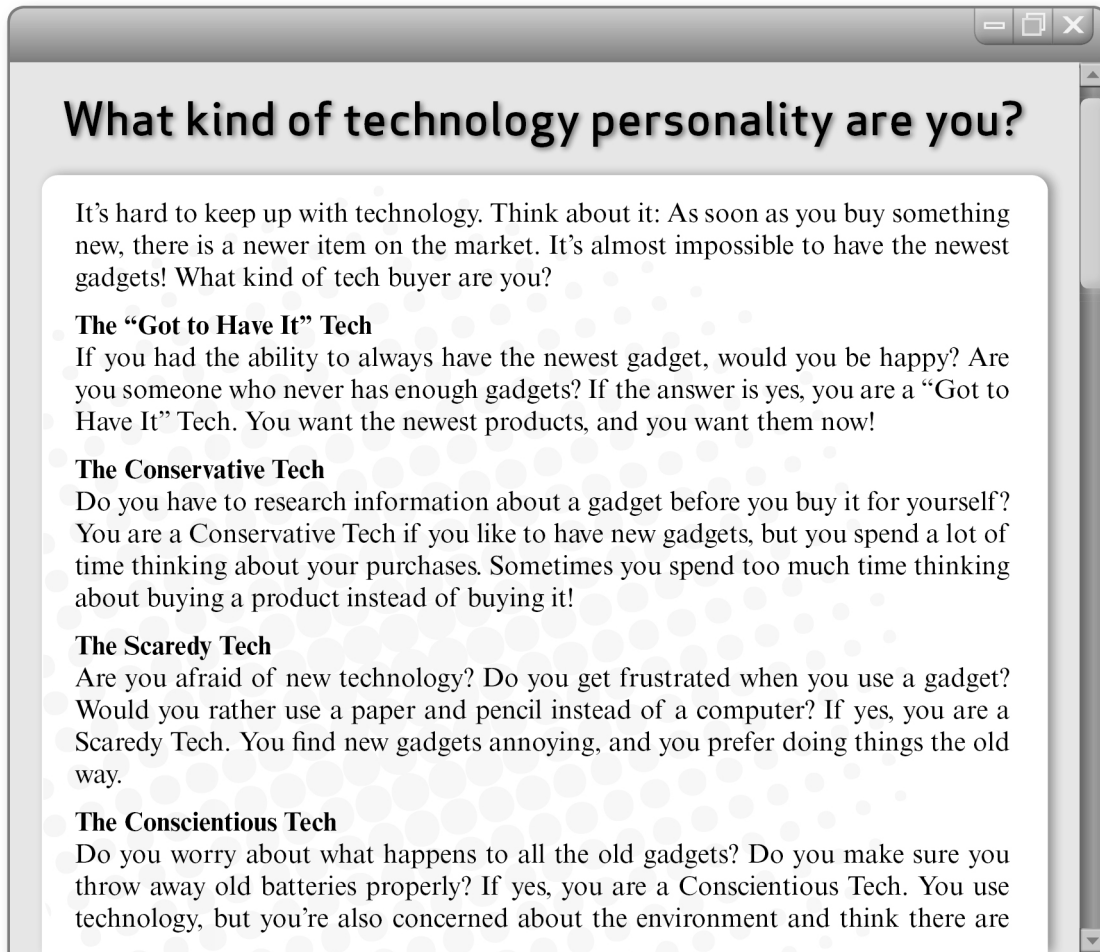
